<p>Room 1 Mrs Hatfull</p>	<p>We are leaning to write great description sentences. Success Criteria: To write a size, shape, colour, doing sentence me. And include a joining word, question and a feeling. We will know we are successful when we are able to:</p> <p>Tuesday, Wednesday Writing Group</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • spell all words from essential list 1-2 • include a thought or a feeling • join 2 sentences using and but, because, or for • do line stretch write all the sounds I can hear then use a simple dictionary to self-correct errors. <p>Thursday Writing Group</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • write words from word card and from around the room • articulate slowly, attempt to identify and locate the initial letter and other dominant sounds • do 2 finger gaps • start at the right place, go the right way, make writing sit on the line. <p>Friday Writing Group</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • draw a picture and make a some writing attempts copying letters from word card • high frequency words from word card • start by the margin and go the right way • begin to develop letter sound association.
<p>Room 2 Mrs Spencer</p>	<p>Maths – Addition & Subtraction Stage 3&4: Solve + and – problems by using strategies in our heads. Stage 5: Solve + & - problems by using doubles. E.g. $8+7=8+8-1$. Tidy numbers $29+18$ as $30+17$ Writing – we are learning to recount events descriptively. Success criteria include what, when, where, who and size, shape, colour, action, number, position and texture.</p>
<p>Room 4 Mr Jeffrey</p>	<p>Maths – we are learning to know the division facts for 2, 5 and 10's. Know groupings within 100 Know groupings within 1000.</p>
<p>Room 6 Mrs Fitz-Herbert</p>	<p>Maths – we are learning to use measurement units to solve measurement problems in everyday situations. E.g. find the area, perimeter, volume. We are revisiting addition and subtraction strategies to problem solve. English – we are revisiting all the surface features required for L2 & L3 writing.</p>
<p>Room 7 Mr Smith</p>	<p>Written English: Room Seven are learning to write arguments. They will do this by clearly state their position and supplying well thought out evidence to back up their position. Physical Education: Room Seven are learning to develop appropriate small ball skills to play games like softball, tee-ball and cricket.</p>
<p>Room 8 Mrs Dalley</p>	<p>English – we are learning to write interesting, accurate, complex sentences and to improve our proof reading & editing. Maths – we are learning to divide using short and/or long working forms.</p>
