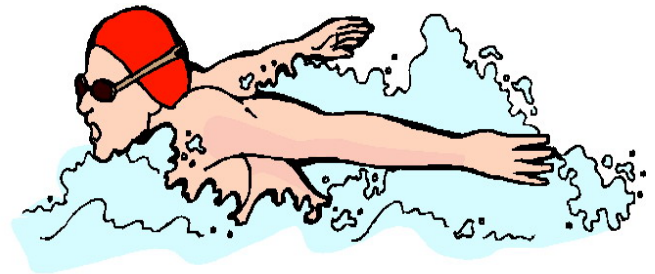
Nga mihi o te wa kia koe me to whanau (Greetings to you and your family)

Room 1 Mrs Hatfull	<p>Maths – we are learning to recognise all the numbers up to 10 and onto 20.</p> <p>We know we can do this when:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • We can make the relevant set • We can sequence the numbers correctly • We can say the number that comes before and after a given number • We can write the number down correctly.
Room 2 Miss Viles	<p>Maths – we are learning to be confident about numbers up to 10 and 20.</p> <p>We will know we are successful when</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • We can say the number before and after in the 1-20 range. • We can use imaging to help us in addition and subtraction. <p>We are learning to add and subtract confidently in a real life situation.</p> <p>We will know we are successful when</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • We can say the number before and after up to 100. • We can use strategies like bundling 10s to help us work out addition and subtraction problems.
Room 3 Mrs Spencer	<p>Maths – we are learning to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Say the number that is 1, 10, 100 more or less on numbers to 1000. • Groupings to 10, 20 and 100. E.g. $7+3=10$, $17+3=20$, $70+30=100$, $43+57=100$ <p>Writing – we are learning to revise and edit our writing.</p> <p>Revise – make improvements by:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Adding more information • Including descriptive words • Using different sentence starters <p>Edit:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Reread our work to check it makes sense. • Check and correct spelling. • Fullstops and capital letters.
Room 6 Miss Gray	<p>In Reading and Writing, we are focusing on identifying and using language features.</p> <p>We will know we have been successful when we can use and identify:</p> <p>Alliteration, similes, onomatopoeia, hyperbole, repetition, rhyme.</p>
Room 7 Mr Smith	<p><u>Mathematics:</u> Room Seven are completing a Statistics Unit where they are learning to collect, organise, construct graphs and interpret data.</p> <p><u>Physical Education:</u> Room Seven are developing the skills of running, jumping and throwing for athletics.</p>
Room 8 Mrs Dalley	<p><u>English:</u> Creating complex sentences using a range of conjunctions to improve our writing, e.g. Although it is likely to be cold, we will be swimming at the pool on Wednesday.</p> <p><u>Maths:</u> Learning to solve division equations using working forms and rounding remainders to two decimal places.</p>
