Powhiri 10am: A couple of protocol matters to make things easier for our welcome

- Prior to entering, we need to assemble near the entrance
 - Girls, ladies in the front.
 - Men, boys at the sides and rear.
- All school bags to be placed OUTSIDE the entrance (not to go on with us) to pick up prior to morning tea.
- Once inside, the Y8’s, men and as many others as possible (women/children) sit to the **right** on the seats. All others sit (or adults may stand) on blue tarps to the **left**.

10.00 Powhiri.
- 10.30 Morning tea - adults provided in dining room.
