## SCHOOLWIDE LEARNING OBJECTIVES

Room 1	<p>Writing: We are learning to write lots of letters and words from our word cards. We are learning to say the name of the letters of the alphabet and give the sound they make.</p> <p>We are learning to write the letters that we can hear and the sounds in a word we can't spell.</p>
Room 1a	<p>Reading: We are learning to make our reading sound like talking. We are especially looking at the word endings, like 's', 'ing', 'ly', and 'ed'.</p> <p>Writing ; We are learning to write all the sounds we can hear in a word, especially blends and word families.</p>
Room 2	<p>Maths : We are learning to -</p> <p><u>Blue</u> - Solve simple addition by counting on &amp; simple subtraction by counting back. (Up to 10).</p> <p><u>Green</u> - Solve addition by counting on &amp; subtraction by counting back.</p> <p><u>Orange</u> - Work with numbers to 100. Say what comes before and after from any number up to 100.</p>
Room 3	<p>Writing: We are learning to write a procedure. We will have a title, goal, materials, steps and a test.</p> <p>Maths: We are learning to use different strategies to add and subtract. These include counting on/back from the largest number, using our knowledge of doubles and facts to 10 and using 'tidy' numbers.</p>
Room 4	<p>Written Language: Poetry - make choice of words, poetic devices (such as similes, metaphors, repetition, rhyming) forms to create a mood within the reader.</p>
Room 5	<p>Sorry no details to hand Mr Jeffrey has been away sick this week.</p>
Room 6	<p>Maths : Geometry - We are learning to describe the features of 2D &amp; 3D objects using geometric language. Describe features of circles, angles and lines. Create nets for 3D shapes.</p>
Room 7	<p>Reading: Room Seven are learning to read for fluency and Science/Technology knowledge understanding. They will do this through reading a series of books with a science and technology knowledge focus.</p>
Room 8	<p>We are learning to understand and use COMPLEX SENTENCES.</p> <p>A complex sentence has an independent clause joined by one or more dependent clauses. A complex sentence always has a subordinator such as <i>because, since, after, although, or when</i> or a relative pronoun such as <i>that, who, or which</i>.</p> <p>E.g.   A. When he handed in his homework, he forgot to give the teacher the last page.</p> <p>        B. The teacher returned the homework after she noticed the error.</p> <p>        C. The students are studying because they have a test tomorrow.</p> <p>        D. After they finished studying, Juan and Maria went to the movies.</p>
