<p>Room 1 Mrs McIntyre</p>	<p>Handwriting - we are learning to hold our pens correctly as we write, make our writing sit on the line and leave spaces between our letters/words.</p> <p>Managing self and relating to others - we are learning to be ready for our school day by being organised - bringing the right work to class and managing our belongings during the school day. We are learning to work in groups using active listening, teamwork and communication. We are thinking about how our behaviour impacts on those around us.</p>
<p>Room 2 Mrs Hatfull Miss Viles</p>	<p>In room 2 we are learning to be confident with numbers up to 100</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Subtract with materials up to 20 • Skip counting forwards and backwards in 2's and 10's • multiplying 2x and 5x by skip counting on our fingers
<p>Room 3 Mrs Spencer</p>	<p>Maths: Continuing with Number: Addition and Subtraction Stage 4: solve + and - problems by counting on or back from the largest number. Stage 5: solve + and - problems by making tens: $8 + 7 = 8 + 2 + 5$ Stage 5i solve + and - problems using tidy numbers $29 + 18$ as $30 + 17$ and Place value $33 + 16$ as $30 + 10 + 3 + 6$</p> <p>Writing We are learning to re-craft our writing. We will do this by:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Reading over our writing to check that it makes sense • Making improvements by adding more detail where it is needed • Making improvements by adding interesting adjectives
<p>Room 5 Ms Cavey</p>	<p><u>Writing (Deeper Features)</u></p> <p>a) Contents & Ideas - I can use a plan/brainstorm/graphic organiser/keywords in my writing b) Sentence Structure - I can use simple and compound sentence, and I attempt complex sentences</p> <p><u>Writing (Surface Features)</u></p> <p>a) Punctuation - I can use speech marks in my writing. b) Editing - I can proofread my writing for spelling, punctuation and grammar accuracy.</p>
<p>Room 6 Miss Gray</p>	<p>We are learning to use correct use dialogue in our writing <i>We show dialogue by using speech marks</i> If we correctly use dialogue, our work will have the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> -Has to be a comma at the end of the last word that is spoken. Eg - "Hello," said Tom. -New line for each speaker. -You ONLY put the speech marks 'around' what is being said- eg "Hello," said Tom. -Other punctuation (!?,.) goes INSIDE the speech marks. Eg "Look out!" said Harry. -It needs to be clear who is saying what. -If the speaking starts half way through the sentence, you need a comma to separate the NOT spoken parts from the spoken parts. -Try to use a different word than said (use the vocab cards)
<p>Room 7 Mr Smith</p>	<p>Mathematics: Room Seven are learning about perimeter, area and volume for measurement. (Once units of measure is finished in the next couple of days) Physical Education: Room Seven will be moving on to learning the skills necessary for the game of hockey. They will also be working on cross country fitness in preparation for the two upcoming interschool events.</p>
<p>Room 8 Mrs Dalley</p>	<p>English: to research, plan and write notes for an interesting, three minute speech on a fresh theme, ready for sharing with the class before the end of this term.</p> <p>Maths: to solve Mathex type problems in small working groups, e.g.: Easier: Q1: What is 20% of 20% of 200? Medium: Q7: What is the smallest number bigger than 55 that has exactly 6 factors? Harder: Q14: A burger, fries and drink cost \$4.80. Two burgers, fries and three drinks cost \$9.70. Two fries and three drinks cost \$5.80. How much do three burgers and a drink cost?</p>

BACKGROUND:

- Instigated by Kasper and Malene Johansen in appreciation of the wonderful time they and their family had here last year...
- Kasper taught our Yr 5/6 class June-Dec last year and Malene was a voluntary teacher aide. They lived in our schoolhouse and their 2 sons Simon now 9½, and Tobias now 12, attended school here
- Denmark is approx ¼ size of NZ, 6m pop. and most people speak English

General Scope of the Project:

- 90 day visit to Denmark, living on Bornholme ("The Sunshine Island" population 40,000), an island off Denmark.
- Learning about life and school life in a foreign country
- Accommodation with Johansen family.
- Attend school with Tobias at a Yr 6-10 school
- One or more trips to Copenhagen – capital of Denmark
- One possible trip to another European capital (E.g. Berlin, London)
- All expenses paid except for spending money – the intention is money will not be a barrier to any student applying.
- Provision has been made for the student to be accompanied on all flights by a known adult, if need be

Likely Selection Criteria

- Student mature enough to be able to cope well being away from home for 3 months
- Student able to speak capably to groups of students and media in both countries regarding life in NZ / their experience in Denmark
- Student will be an excellent ambassador for their school and for the Hunterville community
- Student and family prepared to engage in fundraising opportunities in NZ over next 8-10 months
- (Selection panel likely to comprise principal, DP, BOT rep and major sponsor rep)
