<p>Room 1 Mrs Hatfull/Mrs Parkes</p>	<p>Room One We are learning to be writers</p> <p>Group 1 WALT (We are learning to) To draw a picture and make a some writing attempts copying letters from word card. Writing over teacher written text. Write high frequency words from word card. Start by the margin and go the right way, use 2 finger gaps and a full stop at the end Writing on the line.</p> <p>Group 2 WALT Write some of the sound heard in a spelling attempt; try to use a capital letter and a full stop. 2 finger spaces</p> <p>Group 3 WALT Use capital letters and full stops. Record all the sounds in a spelling attempt, Write a question a feeling or an idea Join a sentence using and, but, for because. Use interesting describing words Use different sentence starters.</p>
<p>Room 2 Miss Viles</p>	<p>Maths</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - We are learning to be confident with numbers up to: 20, 100 and 1000 - use materials like counters and number lines to solve addition and subtraction problems - know the difference between addition and subtraction - count forward or back in my head from the biggest number to solve addition and subtraction - read and write any number up to 1000. Know 1, 10 and 100 more or less up to 1000
<p>Room 3 Mrs Spencer</p>	<p>Reading – we are learning to be careful readers by hearing when we make a mistake then using the meaning of the story and visual cues (letters in the words) to make corrections.</p> <p>Writing – we are learning to be careful writers by checking our story makes sense and making correction where we need to.</p>
<p>Room 6 Mr Johansen</p>	<p>Maths - using times tables and different strategies to do division. Writing - using proof reading to improve writing. Reading - accuracy and speed. PE - ball skills Science - place countries in right part of the world.</p>
<p>Room 7 Mr Smith</p>	<p>English – Room Seven are learning to write sentences using richer language. They will do this by being given a basic sentence and them developing the sentence more for the audience.</p> <p>Mathematics Knowledge: Room Seven are learning to add/subtract/divide/multiply by 10, 100, 1000.</p>
<p>Room 8 Mrs Dalley</p>	<p>English – to write ‘compare and contrast’ reports using correct technical and subject-specific language. Maths – to learn to divide from whole numbers through to decimals divided by decimals using working forms.</p>
