Room 1 Mrs Hatfull	<p>Athletics</p> <p>We are learning to be athletes.</p> <p>Success Criteria:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - To sprint down a lane - To run around the field for 1 lap. - To scissor jump over the high jump - To long jump from a mat and land with a double foot landing. - To throw a tennis ball using an overarm shoulder throw.
Room 2 Mrs Stewart	<p>Maths – we are learning to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Know doubles instantly. E.g. 2+2; 6+6; 10+10. • Count forwards & backwards in 2's, 5's and 10's up to 100. • Use the strategy of 'counting on' from the largest number when adding. E.g. 3+6; put 6 in my head and count on 3 more. <p>Reading – we are learning to</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Can I read ALL of the punctuation in my book. - ! exclamation mark - ? question mark - “ talking marks” - commas ,
Room 3 Mrs Spencer	<p>Writing:</p> <p>Deeper Features: we are learning to identify and use adjectives to add description to our writing.</p> <p>Surface Features: we are learning to check that our writing makes sense by reading what we have written and make corrections, edit for full stops and capital letters.</p> <p>Reading:</p> <p>We are identifying speech and question marks in our reading.</p> <p>Maths:</p> <p>We are learning to improve our speed and accuracy with our basic facts.</p>
Room 5 Mrs Fitz-Herbert	<p>English – we are learning to use commas in our writing to separate items in a list, to indicate a pause or to add extra, information.</p> <p>Maths – we are learning to read roman numerals. Know groups of 10's, and 100's in 3 & 4 digit numbers.</p>
Room 6 Miss Gray	<p>We are learning to recall number bonds to 100, 1000 and 10,000</p> <p>We are learning to feel confident as writers and come up with our own ideas.</p>
Room 7 Mr Smith	<p>Mathematics: Room Seven are learning to develop a number of effective addition and subtraction strategies. They will do this by understanding strategies like place value, breaking into 1's, 10's, 100's and tidy number, moving to the nearest 10, 100.</p> <p>Reading: Room Seven are learning to read for fluency and expression. They will do this by reading a number of different types of texts to a number of different people.</p>
Room 8 Mrs Dalley	<p>Mathematics:</p> <p>We are working on solving linear equations and showing the working:</p> <p>E.g. $x + 3 = 9$</p> $x + 3 - 3 = 9 - 3$ $x = 6$ <p>English:</p> <p>We are working on building reading mileage, fluency and all aspects of comprehension in class, and hopefully, more concentrated home reading by children, or by adults to children, with the children carefully following the reading with their eyes or fingers.</p>
