CLASSROOM FOCUSES

Room 1 Mrs Hatfull/Mrs Parkes	We are working on consolidating our number knowledge to 20. We can recognise the odd and even numbers and we can skip count. We are instantly recalling our basic facts to 5 and practising our facts to 10.
Room 2 Miss Viles	We are learning to be confident at patterns, relationships and equations in Algebra level one and two <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • finish a repeating pattern and continue a growing pattern • create a growing pattern and use our knowledge of the objects in the pattern to predict the next object/number • show relationships in patterns and use less and greater than symbols correctly
Room 3 Mrs Spencer	Writing – we are learning to write interesting opening sentences that grab the readers attention. We can do this by using language features such as onomatopoeia, simile, our senses and strong feeling statements.
Room 6 Miss Gray	We are all learning about fractions in Room 6. Here are some of our WALTs. We are learning to show $\frac{1}{2}$, $\frac{1}{4}$, $\frac{1}{3}$ and $\frac{1}{5}$ We are learning to find fractions of a set We are learning to find which fraction is bigger
Room 7 Mr Smith	Mathematics: Room Seven are learning to understand the link fractions have with decimals and percentages. Eg $\frac{2}{5}=0.2=20\%$ Physical Education: Room Seven are learning to develop the appropriate skills to play the game of football.
Room 8 Mrs Dalley	English: We are learning to plan carefully using a mind map, before writing narratives. Criteria: Set scene - Outline key characters - Outline plot – with a good hook, to grab readers! - List problems/complications - Plan solutions/resolution of complications - Note idea for ending Mathematics: We are learning to use factorials (n!) e.g. $4! = 4 \times 3 \times 2 \times 1 = 24$ Example: Use only four 4s and operation signs to make other numbers: $4! \div \sqrt{4} - \frac{4}{4} = 11$, or $4! \div \sqrt{4} + \frac{4}{4} = 13$,
