## SCHOOLWIDE LEARNING OBJECTIVES

Room 1	We are learning to say the names of all the letters of the alphabet and give the sound each letter makes so we can use them to write great stories and become great readers. We are learning to recognise all our basic words in our word jars and in our note books so we can quickly become great readers.
Room 1a	PE: We are learning <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>❖ to roll forwards safely by starting with our legs apart, tucking our head well under and looking backwards, before we roll forwards. We stand up to finish.</li> <li>❖ To jump off one foot, land with two feet, and stand still.</li> <li>❖ Bounce in control on the mini tramp.</li> </ul> Music: We are learning the words to our production song ... (It's coming along pretty well).
Room 2	We are learning to: Group A & B - Use full stops and capital letters correctly. Group C - Use a plan before we write. Group D - Join 2 ideas in a sentence by using and, but, because, so.
Room 3	Maths: We are learning how to find the rule for a sequential pattern using numbers. Reading: We are showing that we understand what we read by putting the events in the story in order and predicting what will come next.
Room 4	Written Language: Miss Smith is teaching us various forms/styles of poems. We are also learning for general writing to write longer sentences by using conjunctions and commas.
Room 5	We are learning to identify features of formal letters. <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Write neatly.</li> <li>2. Use one side of the paper only.</li> <li>3. Use short paragraphs leaving one line between them.</li> <li>4. Don't use a comma after the greeting or after the close. E.g. Yours sincerely</li> </ol>
Room 6	Reading/Written English: We are learning to read, write, comprehend & follow logical sequenced instructions. Identify & understand the features of a procedure. E.g. command verbs, adverbs method, etc.
Room 7	Written English: Room Seven are learning to write arguments focussing on spelling, punctuation, linked and organised information. Physical Education: Room Seven are learning the 'dominant movement patterns' for gymnastics. These are spring, rotation, balance, landing, locomotion and statics.
Room 8	Mathematics: We are learning to understand and use divisibility rules for 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 8, 9 and 10. E.g. The rules for 3 and 9 involve adding the digits together, and checking the divisibility. E.g. Is 438 divisible by 3? Yes because $4+3+8 = 15$ which is divisible by 3. Is 972 divisible by 9? Yes because $9+7+2 = 18$ which is divisible by 9
