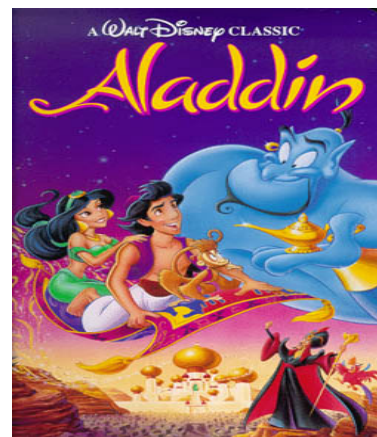
(SORRY - THURSDAY NIGHT ALL SOLD OUT AS AT THIS MORNING!)

And just a reminder, that we make no money from the production; in fact we budget to run at a loss, which we will undoubtedly do again this time around!

Other Production Reminders / Info ...

- All students from all classes are performing. We ask parents to please make students available for all performances – or to let us know urgently if for some reason this is not possible
- All students will have at least two appearances on stage – in most cases as part of their class act, and also as part of the finale, which in itself is always a highlight of each show
- Students will be required at school at approximately 6.45pm for each evening performance
- **On the two days following each evening performance (i.e. the Thursday and Friday morning) school will begin at 11am** – and all buses will be running exactly two hours later than normal. However, all teachers will be at school at the usual time on those days and students are still welcome to arrive at school at their normal time if this suits parents.

- For each performance students wait with their teacher in their classroom before and after they appear on stage. Please refer to the slip enclosed with the newsletter where we request parent volunteers to help with each room during performances. Duties include general supervision, helping to apply makeup and helping students with costumes, etc.

SCHOOLWIDE LEARNING OBJECTIVES

Room 1	Handwriting - We are learning to hold our pen correctly. (See photo below). Publishing - We are learning to be great illustrators. We know we are successful when it looks like a picture. There are lots of colours. There could be a frame. There is not much white showing.
Room 1a	Maths: We are learning to describe 2 and 3 dimensional shapes using our own words. We will learn to use the words corners and sides to compare different shapes.
Room 2	Writing: We are learning to: A. Use fullstops & capital letters correctly. B. B. Join 2 ideas in a sentence with and & because. C. Use a plan before we write. D. Use different sentence beginnings,
Room 3	Reading/Writing: We are learning that different types of reading have different purposes. E.g. to entertain, give instructions, explain how things work and we are linking this with our writing. Inquiry: We are learning to form our own questions about How life has changed in New Zealand since 1900 and we are finding information and placing it within the correct timeframe.
Room 4	Maths Knowledge - Tiny Teddies: We are learning to ❖ Instantly recall doubles and halves (and big doubles). E.g. $60+60=120$. $\frac{1}{2}$ of $140=70$. Cool Calculators: ❖ Count forward and back in 1s, 10s, 100s with numbers past 1000.
Room 5	Maths: We are learning to - ❖ Order fractions from smallest to largest using a fraction chart. ❖ To rename improper fractions as mixed fraction numbers. ❖ To express fractions as decimals and percentages.
Room 6	Maths : Geometry - We are learning to describe the features of 2D & 3D objects using geometric language. Describe features of circles, angles and lines. Create nets for 3D shapes.
Room 7	Room Seven is learning to read fluently through non fiction science/technology books.
Room 8	Reading: We are learning to use Blooms Taxonomy to develop better reading understanding and comprehension questions from short stories and articles. E.g. Bloom's Taxonomy has lower and higher order thinking skills: Lower: Remembering, Understanding and Applying. Higher: Analyzing, Evaluating, Creating.
