SCHOOLWIDE LEARNING OBJECTIVES

Room 1	Oral Language - We are learning to make a speech. Success Criteria: stand up tall, look at the audience, speak clearly so my words can be heard, speak about a topic I am interested in and include a "feeling statement".
Room 1a	Oral Language - We are learning to make a speech. Success Criteria: stand up tall, look at the audience, speak clearly so my words can be heard, speak about a topic I am interested in and include a "feeling statement".
Room 2	We are learning to give an interesting speech to an audience.
Room 3	Reading - We are learning to use a dictionary to help us when we come to words we don't know the meanings of. We are also learning to use the words around our new word to find out the meanings (Context). Writing/Spelling - We are learning more about word families and common spelling patterns to help us write new words.
Room 4	Handwriting - We are learning to know how to link letters and slope consistently. Maths - We are learning to solve unknown times tables by using x tables I know. E.g. $8 \times 9 = (5 \times 9) + (3 \times 9)$ $= 45 + 27$ $= 72$
Room 5	Sorry - Mr Jeffery is away on camp for a few days.
Room 6	We are learning to identify and understand the specific language features of Explanations, through Reading and Writing. We are learning to use fractions to solve maths problems in everyday situations.
Room 7	English - Room Seven are learning to write newspaper reports. They will do this by writing a number of reports about what happened at Hunterville School and make a mini newspaper in a group. Physical Education - Room Seven are learning to develop better small ball skills. They will do this by throwing, catching, hitting a ball and also through the game of softball.
Room 8	We are learning to use interesting adverbs, adjectives and literary features to make our writing more effective.
