

# HUNTERVILLE SCHOOL

## ENROLMENT SCHEME

### Purposes

- To avoid overcrowding of the likelihood of overcrowding.
- To manage the selection of applicants from outside the school zone in a fair and transparent manner.

### Principles

- Students living within the home zone have the absolute right to enrol at any time.
- No more students are excluded than necessary to avoid overcrowding.
- The Hunterville School Board of Trustees have committed to take all reasonable steps to ensure that, when setting the number of places available for the following year for out of zone enrolments, *the number of those places exceeds the number of siblings of current students wishing to enrol.*

All students who live within the home zone described below shall be entitled to enrol at the school.

### Home Zone:

The home zone is described from the perspective of the Hunterville School site and includes all properties with access to the following streets and roads:

All of State Highway 1 and any side streets/roads off it between Otara Road in the north east and Porewa Rd in the south west, and within the context of:

Towards Mataroa School:

Watershed Road between and including Te Kumu Road in the north and Kie Kie Road in the south.

Towards Mangaweka School to the north east:

Otara Road and Peka Road.

Towards Rangiwahia School:

Mangamako Road until the intersection with Marshall Road, including Marshall Road.

Orangipongo Road, Sandon Block Road, and Mangatieka Road.

Towards Waituna West School:

Vinegar Hill Road (SH54) and any roads off it, to Lower Pakihikura Road, but not including Lower Pakihikura Road. Sandon Block Road and any roads off it, including Waipuru Road to the end of Waipuru Road only.

Towards Marton School:

Porewa Road as far as and including the property at number 49 Porewa Rd, approximately 0.5km from SH1. Mount Curl Road as far as the intersection to Warrens Road, excluding Warrens Road itself. Leedstown Road as far as its intersection with Jeffersons Line. Jeffersons Line between its intersection with Leedstown Road and SH1.

Towards Papanui Junction School:

All of Mangahoe Rd. Turakina Valley Road from Mangahoe Road, north and to including 5891 Turakina Valley Road. James Road and Pohonui Road up to and including Locks Road. Ongo Road, north to Turakina Valley Road including Omango Valley Road.

Proof of residence within the home zone may be required.

Each year, applications for enrolment in the following year from in-zone students will be sought by a date which will be published in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school. This will enable the board to assess the number of places which can be made available to students who live outside the home zone.

### **Date of Commencement**

This enrolment scheme will be effective from 1 January 2012.

### **Out of zone enrolments**

Each year the board will determine the number of places which are likely to be available in the following year for the enrolment of students who live outside the home zone. The board will publish this information by notice in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school. The notice will indicate how applications are to be made and will specify a date by which all applications must be received. Applications for enrolment will be processed in the following order of priority:

| <u>First Priority</u>  | This priority category is not applicable at this school because the school does not run a special programme approved by the Secretary.            |
| <u>Second Priority</u> | must be given to applicants who are siblings of current students.   |
| <u>Third Priority</u>  | must be given to applicants who are siblings of former students.  |
| <u>Fourth Priority</u> | must be given to any applicant who is a child of a former student of the school.  |
| <u>Fifth Priority</u>  | must be given to any applicant who is either a child of an employee of the board of the school or a child of a member of the board of the school. |
| <u>Sixth priority</u>  | must be given to all other applicants.  |

If there are more applicants in the second, third, fourth, fifth or sixth priority groups than there are places available, selection within the priority group will be by a ballot conducted in accordance with instructions issued by the Secretary under Section 11G(1) of the Education Act 1989. Parents will be informed of the date of any ballot by notice in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school.
